ALL STUDENTS will be entering their course requests online through a Google Form. The form will be available between January 06, 2022 and January 28, 2022.



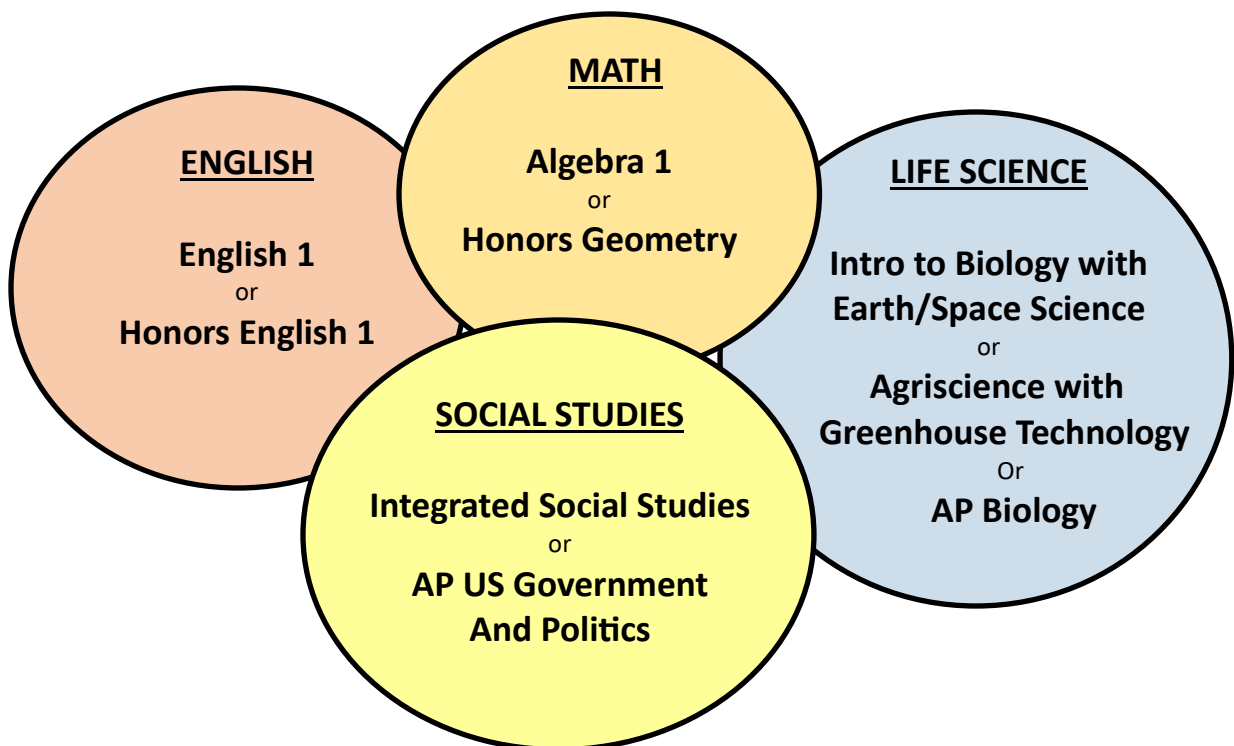

- **Your core teachers will recommend your placement for English and math.** You will then select your life science, social studies and request 2 elective courses to fill out your schedule requests.
- You should request an additional 3 alternate courses in case you do not get your first choices of electives!
- Please read all information and make your selections carefully before entering your requests in the Google form.

REQUIRED COURSES — one course from each circle is required for all 9th grade students! Your middle school teachers and counselors will recommend your course placement for English and math. The recommendations will be based largely on your MAP scores as well as your course grades and academic behaviors.



CAREER PATHWAY COURSES

— you may select at least one career pathway course from the options below. Beginning a career pathway your freshman year will increase your chances of being post-secondary ready when you graduate from high school. When you are postsecondary ready it means you have the skills you need to move on to college, a trade school, or straight into a job. Being postsecondary ready also means you have options to go to work or serve in an internship as a senior and not have to take all academic classes in the building!

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SAMPLE 4-YEAR ACADEMIC PLANS
